**Armer Kimble Preston** was a strong believer in the value of education. This scholarship program honors her legacy.

Recognizing that they were all blessed with college scholarships, and thereby the opportunity to pursue a higher education, the Collins Family's goal is to provide scholarships to high school seniors in need of additional resources. Students who have demonstrated leadership, character, community involvement, and academic success will be given consideration for these awards.

## **Scholarship Program Guidelines**

- Funds will be paid directly to the college or university where the recipient is enrolled. The allocation is \$300 per semester, for the Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 semesters, respectively.
- Recipients must maintain a 2.7 GPA, enroll in AND successfully complete a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester.
- Grade reports must be submitted at the conclusion of the fall semester, prior to receiving the award for the spring semester.
- The first installment will be issued after the recipient submits proof of enrollment from the school's registrar's office.
- The scholarship will be forfeited if the recipient fails to enroll in the Fall of 2022 or does not meet all requirements set therein.
